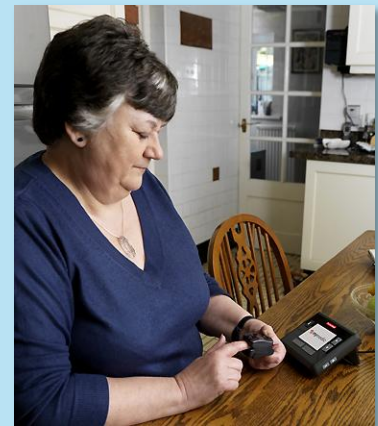
The Why and How of ICT in Integrated Care Service Provision
